CITTASLOW GOOLWA COMMUNITY GARDEN

It certainly feels like ground hog day at the Community Garden at the moment. The weather continues to play havoc. The die-hard volunteers who arrived on Wednesday (a few weeks ago), felt like they had been transported to Venice, with rain registering over 100 ml and flooding the whole area.

However not to be deterred, with Spring on our doorstep the focus has turned to building and maintenance, which is always high on the list of things to do.



We have just completed another shed at the rear of the Garden to house our fertilizers, purchased with the generous support of Neutrog, and our trusty generator. It's now time to do inventory on our garden beds, to prepare them for our new summer seedling crops. However after listening to Sophie Thompson at the Gardens Alive Expo, our plantings might be delayed a little if the weather continues to impersonate winter.

The children's area pergola has just been given a fresh coat of paint and both pergolas will soon be getting a facelift with some new shade cloth.

We are in the process of re-landscaping the two areas around our apple trees; with new borders and erecting two arbors that will provide shade in summer, to protect the apple crops. We have also turned one of the areas along the fence line into a colourful flowerbed to encourage the bees and friendly insects to visit us.

Interest in leasing garden beds has continued with an additional 4 beds being made available from the Community Garden's allocation, taking the leased bed total to 24.

Our jams and chutneys continue their popularity at Signal Point. We now have approximately 35 different varieties for people to choose from. All proceeds go to maintaining the garden and allowing us to provide lease beds to the community at an affordable price.

Lyn Mateer and Anna Leahy represented Cittaslow and the Community Garden at the Gardens Alive Expo, on 1st Oct. It was a great event to showcase Cittaslow and the Garden and gave us the opportunity to promote and sell our jams, chutneys and the Smoke Off raffle tickets, as well as give away selected produce grown at the garden. We look forward to seeing some of the people who stopped for a chat at the garden in the future.

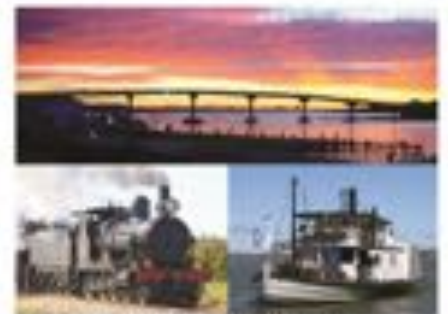

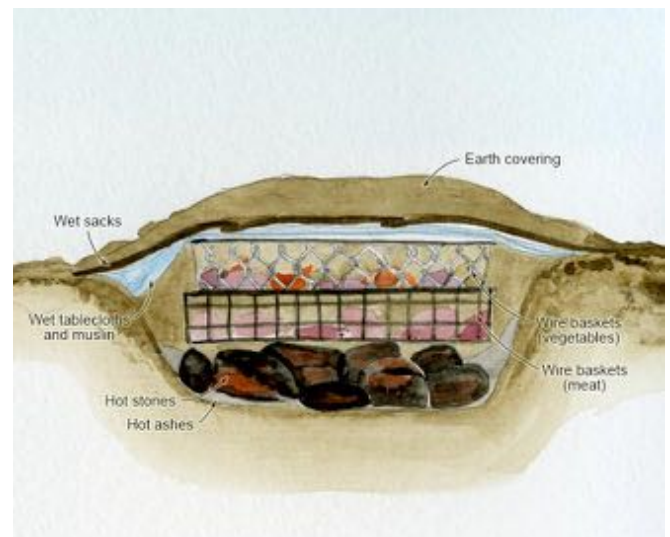

REPORT FROM GADBUG

Extracts from the GADBUG newsletter:

Wednesday, 28/09/16, was a cool morning with a strongish NE breeze of gusting to 35kph at ride start time. The forecast was for some pretty rough weather to arrive later in the day. Here are the twelve riders at the wharf at 8:30am.

Anne wanted to ride locally and was going to do No 19 and was joined by Bruce, who was looking for a short ride. Ruth and Elaine both enjoyed the ride to Laffin's point together and on their return they detoured to ride on to meet Anne and Bruce coming back from Beacon 19. They all rode back to Goolwa and went for some enjoyable coffee at the Heritage.

Margaret, Alan, JohnD and Julie rode along the Encounter Bikeway and made their way to Port Elliott. They met Brian and all had coffee together at the RetroVibe. Julie reported *'The ride back was slow, due to the strong, gusty headwind wind'*. The Victor Harbor group of Michael, Jane, Max, Peter, Gavin & I departed for the Encounter bikeway. Geoff joined us along Surfers Parade & Brian, just back from the US, also rode with us to Pt Elliot. It was a very easy ride out with a good tailwind. We stopped at the whale nursery to decide where to go & agreed to do Beyond, Waterport, Wagon & Swains into Victor followed by coffee at 'The Closet'. All went well until we departed for home and found we now had a headwind of 43kph wind gusting to 61kph. It made for some hard work riding against it. We rode via Tukuremoar Reserve where the track flooding was now down just to rim depth & passable.

The water had risen considerably in Tukuremoar Reserve, the water was up to the 2nd wire of the fence along the track. I'd guess 500mm deep. It may be a quite a while before we ride thru here again. There was more water across the Bikeway in Bashams Park but still rideable & should dry soon.

Friday wasn't the best riding day. We had some heavy rain overnight and the morning was pretty cool & very windy. Jane & I found no other GAD-BUG riders at the wharf at 8:30am, Regardless we decided to ride on & explore the results of the heavy rain. We rode to Victor and saw plenty of flooding along the way.

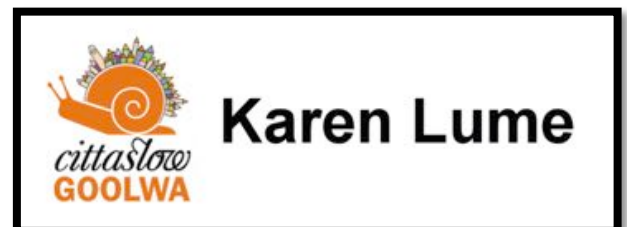
