President's Report to the Annual General Meeting of Cittaslow Goolwa Inc

The year 2018 – 2019 has seen the continual growth and development of Cittaslow Goolwa in so many respects. The consistent increase in membership – now numbering more than 240 members – is testament not only to the ongoing relevance of the goals and objectives of Cittaslow but also the recognition of its practical contribution to improving the social, economic and cultural life of the community and caring for our region's heritage and environment.

There have been great times and challenging – or at least interesting – times, but I have appreciated the support you have given me in my first year as President and value most highly the friendships we have forged.

To those members who have just retired – Julie Low, Antonio Trimboli and Scott Woodsmith – we acknowledge your enormous contributions and hope that you remain actively involved in Cittaslow one way or another.
